Landcare is a community-based approach to managing and restoring our natural environment, and improving the sustainability of our agricultural activities.

Being part of a Landcare group means having access to funding and/or training opportunities when they become available. It also enables communities to network with other locals who share a passion for environmental protection.

Caniaba is a strategic wildlife corridor. Many threatened fauna and flora species have been recorded in the area. A vital linear corridor made up of koala habitat and dry rainforest, runs from east to west, and is a critical link in an area that has had natural vegetation dramatically altered over the years.
